

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that the history of Guam and the evolution of its culture have shaped and
- 4 influenced the artistic traditions of the indigenous people. The practice and

perpetuation of traditional visual arts, crafts, music, dance, and storytelling contribute to the preservation of culture and therefore, to the preservation of the life and values of the community.

There exists among the practitioners of Guam's folk and traditional arts those who are considered masters of the art. It is the intent of *I Liheslatura* that such practitioners be given due recognition for their artistry and craftsmanship, and their efforts to preserve Guam's rich history and cultural traditions through the practice and perpetuation of their art.

It is additionally the intent of *I Liheslatura* to establish in law a set of guidelines and criteria by which to select and judge the worthiness of a candidate for the Guam Masters Award.

Section 2. Creation of the Guam Masters Award. A new Chapter 85A is added to Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"Chapter 85A

Guam Masters Award

§85A 101. Short Title. This Act *shall* be known and cited as the "Guam Masters Award Act."

§85A 102. Creation. There is created within the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency (CAHA) the Guam Masters Award, to be given to accomplished practitioners of Guam's folk and traditional arts who have contributed to the preservation, advancement, and appreciation of their art.

§85A 103. Award Frequency and Limitations. CAHA shall accept nominations for the Guam Masters Award during the month of April 2010 and every four (4) years thereafter. No more than four (4) awards may be given during each award year. Nominations for the Guam Masters



COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. <u>OVERVIEW</u>

The Committee on Tourism, Cultural Affairs, Youth, and Public Broadcasting convened a public hearing on Tuesday, January 26, 2010 at 9:00 a.m. in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. The item on the agenda was the consideration of Bill No. 305-30 (COR) – "An act to add a new Chapter 85A to Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to creating the Guam Masters Award to recognize master practitioners of Guam's traditional and folk arts," sponsored by B.J.F. Cruz

<u>Public Notice Requirements</u>

All legal requirements for public notices were met. Notice of the hearing was published in the Marianas Variety on January 19, 2010 and in the Pacific Daily News on January 21, 2010. Notices were disseminated via e-mail, facsimile, and hand delivery to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on January 19, 2010, and again on January 25, 2010. Notice of the hearing was also posted on the Guam Legislature's website.

Senators Present

The public hearing was called to order at 9:00 a.m.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Vice Speaker B.J.F. Cruz called Monica Guzman and Patrick Bamba to testify.

Patrick Bamba, Executive Director, Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities, submitted testimony (attached) in **support** of Bill No. 305-30 (COR).

Monica Guzman, Member, Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Board of Directors, submitted testimony (attached) in **support** of Bill No. 305-30 (COR).

Sen. Telo Taitague asked about the member of the Masters Committee.

Bamba replied the Committee was made up of former members, directors, and deputy directors of CAHA, CAHA Board, CAHA staff, Dr. Flores.

Monica Guzman added, Dr. Judy Flores, Mr. Tony Lamorena, Mr. Juan Rosario, Mr. Johnny Sablan, Ms. Sylvia Flores. Guzman further clarified that, should this legislation pass, CAHA would form a committee to determine guidelines for the process. She made clear that the Masters Policy Committee came up with an outline of what the selection process should entail. One of the things that were discussed was not defining different disciplines so as not to limit the art form. What was ensured was that whomever nominates an artist really puts together a compelling argument for that nominee's merit as a master.

Dr. Judy Flores, Folk Arts Coordinator, CAHA Board of Directors, appeared before the Committee **in support** of Bill No. 305 and stated that through this proposed legislation, they hope more of Guam's deserving masters will be recognized on the national level.

Sen. Taitague asked if any funding will be needed and stated she supports the program and looks forward to its inception.

Bamba replied there is not a line item in the current budget. As the process moves forward, there will be needs like actual awards, marketing campaigns, so the public and private sectors will be solicited. CAHA has not put a dollar figure on the needs of the masters program as yet.

Sen. Respicio asked how much CAHA received in grants in 1997 to execute a masters program.

Bamba stated he is not certain and agreed with Sen. Respicio that it may be a suitable basis for determining how much funding would be needed.

Sen. Respicio recognized the importance of legislating the program to give the award its due credibility. He questioned, if the bill becomes law, is CAHA ready to receive nominations for the month of April?

Guzman replied, if and when the law passes, Chamorro month would be the month on which the program is launched. Then between April and June, nominations will be accepted. Nominations will be reviewed by the CAHA staff who will pass them forward to a committee comprised of board members in the hopes that the first master(s) under this program will be recognized at the end of this year.

Sen. Respicio asked for clarification over the launch month and the nomination period and whether CAHA will be ready to accept nominations in April. He then referred to page three (3) of the bill and in the interest of continuity, he suggested having the selection procedures in the bill adopted through the AAA process. He said this will establish the standard of the award so that incoming boards or administrations do not undo the work of the current board.

Guzman recalled the process of creating the bill and that the Masters Policy Committee deliberated over the best way to move forward and if including it in the legislation will make the award that much stronger then the Committee can develop the selection procedures.

Sen. Respicio suggests revising the bill to include criteria but affirms his support of the bill.

Vice Speaker Cruz thanked the public for coming and providing testimony and announced he will leave the record open for an additional ten (10) days for submissions of written testimony.

Testimony in Support of the Bill No. 305-30 An Act to Create the Guam Masters Award January 26, 2010 (9:00 a.m.)

Hafa Adai! Chairman Cruz and members of the Committee. I am Patrick R. Bamba, Executive Director of the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency. It is my privilege to come before you today to testify in support of Bill No. 305-30: The Guam Masters Award Bill.

The Masters Program came about from a 1997 CAHA grant to artist Ron Castro that paid tribute and documented the life traditions of many of Guam's remaining folk and traditional masters. CAHA recognized the need and importance of documenting existing traditions that were an essential part of Guam's people and their way of life, that were literally passing away before us. Although the program is noteworthy, there were no established written guidelines or criteria regarding the selection of the individuals given the title of "Master". Since the inception of the program many years ago, no other cultural practitioners have been bestowed the title of "Master". Many of the masters who were officially recognized have passed away.

At the urging of Governor Camacho, CAHA's current Board of Directors decided that it was time to resurrect the Masters Program. The Board realized its intrinsic value and that the transmission of these practices from generation to generation is imperative to ensure the preservation of our Chamorro traditions. The depository of the Chamorro heritage is in the minds of these cultural practitioners whose bodies are the vehicles in which the knowledge and skills of that tradition are manifested and performed. The intent to reinstate the Masters program is to give due recognition to those practitioners and to safeguard/support the continuing transmission of the knowledge and skill related with traditional artistry through the continued practice of the craft within the community.

Efforts to protect traditional craftsmanship should focus not on the products itself, but on creating conditions that will encourage traditional artisans and crafters to continue to produce crafts and to pass on their knowledge and skills to others. As a result, the Masters Policy Committee was established to develop a Masters Award Policy for the purpose of acknowledging and recognizing Traditional Master Artists and Crafters. Discussion focused on the review of the criteria of other jurisdictions and artistic disciplines, the development of Guam criteria, creation of a timeline, policy draft by CAHA, the legislature's codification of the Masters Policy and formal announcement of the program to the public. The committee worked closely with representatives of the Chairman's Office and has a result of that collaboration came the draft of Bill No. 305-30.

On behalf of our children and generations of Chamorro to come, I ask that you pass Bill No. 305-30. It is our hope to successfully execute the Masters Program in 2010. The creation of the Guam Masters Award will provide recognition to the master practitioners and bearers of Guam's traditional and folk arts and ensure the preservation of these traditions. The establishment of this award would guarantee the continuity of our cultural traditions, leaving our children, who are the stakeholders, a vested legacy.

TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF BILL 305 Submitted by Monica Okada Guzman Member, Board of Directors, Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities

Tuesday, January 26, 2010

Hafa Adai and Thank you for giving me the opportunity to testify in support of Bill 305, the creation of the Guam Masters Award.

At the time of my confirmation hearing several years ago to serve as a member of the Board of Directors of the Guam Council of Arts and Humanities, I expressed my interest in developing an overall Masters Policy for our artists. This has been one of my main focuses since that time and I am pleased to know that others such as the author of this bill concur with the need to codify a policy that will enhance and preserve our cultural and traditional art-forms and our heritage.

Over the years we have lost many of our "Master Artists" and along with them, we have also lost many of the artistic nuances, traditional processes and a wealth of cultural histories. We have had many discussions at the Council over the past year deliberating over this matter and how best to approach developing this award and its selection criteria. Over a period of five months, a committee was formed comprised of former directors and deputy directors of CAHA, the current management and staff as well as members of the Board. We met regularly to discuss how best to develop and formalize a process by which a masters program could best be realized – a process that would define what we should consider traditional and cultural arts and how we can best recognize and celebrate those who perpetuate it.

We reviewed nomination guidelines and criteria from at least 15 jurisdictions to include the National Heritage Foundation of the National Endowment for the Arts and Humanities, the American Indian and other state art agencies as well as other countries in our western pacific vicinity.

Through this review process, we discovered the common denominator of each of the different Masters Policies included some basic foundations such as peer recognition, continuing artistic accomplishment and teaching and advocacy of their art. Most importantly, the fundamental driver for these policies was each jurisdiction's recognition and acknowledgement that their traditional arts were important and worthwhile to the preservation of their culture and heritage as a community or as a people.

Our current masters program is all encompassing with categories that include everything from blacksmiths to linguists, chanters to storytellers, net makers to weavers. Their histories and backgrounds can be found on posters and coffee table books proudly displayed in many private offices, public buildings, our hospital, and our homes. Lovingly documented by local artist Ron Castro, it is unfortunate that many of these posters have become eulogies to some these great masters that have

passed on. Luckily, a number of these masters also passed on their knowledge and craft secrets to individuals and families who are continuing their great works. To that end, many of our practitioners today are wondering how they too could be recognized as Masters in their crafts.

Bill 305 calls for the Council on the Arts and Humanities to establish nomination guidelines that will be used to determine what constitutes a master craftsman in our traditional arts. I am pleased to report that our masters committee has already been discussing these guidelines and are prepared to roll up our sleeves and work hard to finalize and implement them.

In these most uncertain times of growth and modernization, I can think of no more noble endeavor than to preserve that which has brought us this far as an indigenous people. Time is very much against us in this endeavor as many of our remaining traditional arts masters are aging and we must preserve their skills and the historical and cultural significance of their crafts.

I congratulate Senator Cruz who worked with us to develop this legislation. He has been and continues to be a strong proponent of our culture. I urge the members of this legislature and the governor to pass and sign this bill into law so that we can ensure that our culture, traditions and heritage is preserved and celebrated for the future generations to follow.

§ 85A101. Short Title.

This Act shall be known and cited as the "Guam Masters Award Act."

§ 85A102. Creation.

There is created within the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency (CAHA) the Guam Masters Award, to be given to accomplished practitioners of Guam's folk and traditional arts who have contributed to the preservation, advancement, and appreciation of their art.

§ 85A103. Award Frequency and Limitations.

CAHA shall accept nominations for the Guam Masters Award during the month of April 2010 and every four (4) years thereafter. No more than four (4) awards may be given during each award year. Guam Masters Award – "Guam National Treasure" for Traditional and Folk Arts Nomination Packet

GUAM MASTERS AWARD – "GUAM NATIONAL TREASURE"

The Guam Masters Award – "Guam National Treasure" created through Public Law 30-139 was established to recognize master practitioners of Guam's Traditional and Folk Arts. The award gives due recognition to these master practitioners for their artistry and craftsmanship, and their continuing efforts to preserve Guam's rich history and cultural traditions through the practice and perpetuation of their arts. The award acknowledges artists whose contributions, primarily through teaching, advocacy, organizing and preserving important repertoires, have greatly benefited their artistic tradition; and whose efforts have significantly increased opportunities for and public visibility of traditional and folk arts.

FOLK AND TRADITIONAL ARTS

The terms "traditional" and folk may be used interchangeably to refer to those aspects of learned behavior (culture) that are transferred through word of mouth and/ or by following an example set within a cultural group. Traditional art is learned from family or community members and is passed along through generations, with each artist remaining true to time-honored methods or techniques, yet free to add personal creativity to the process. Folk or traditional artists are highly trained, and it is the manner of their training that earns them the designation of "folk".

The following information is provided by Georgine Clarke and Joey Brackner of the Alabama State Council on the Arts (www.arts.alabama.gov).

Folk arts are defined as artistic expressions that have grown through time within a group or community that shares a common location, occupation, religion, language, or culture. These "grass roots" arts can be found in every culture and are passed on from one generation to the next, usually through oral tradition, often by observing a master. Traditional arts are a broad term for the artistic activities that are passed down from one generation to the next. These can include traditional music, dance, crafts, and local architectural styles. Traditional arts include folk arts, a term that more specifically refer to grass roots community traditions.

Folk Arts ARE:

- 1. Living traditional practice passed down over time and through space. Since most folklore is passed down through generations, it is closely connected to community history.
- 2. Shared by a group of people who have something in common: language, ethnicity, family, region, occupation, religion, nationality, age, gender, social class, social clubs, school, etc. Everyone belongs to various groups; therefore, everyone has folklore of some sort.
- 3. Learned informally by word of mouth, observation, and/or imitation.
- 4. Made up of conservative elements (motifs) that stay the same through many transmissions, but folklore also changes in transmission (variants). In other words, folk traditions have longevity, but are dynamic and adaptable.
- 5. Usually anonymous in origin.

Folk Arts are NOT:

- 1. Learned primarily through workshops, classes, books, or magazines.
- 2. Necessarily old or an antique.
- 3. Written history, nor historical re-enactment (re-creating the past with actors).

II. ELIGIBILITY

Nominees must be permanent residents of Guam and be individuals worthy of recognition and have a record of continuing artistic accomplishment. They must be **actively participating** in their art form, either as an apprentice, practitioners or as teachers and must **engaged** in perpetuating the folk and traditional arts **for more than 20 consecutive years.** This award recognizes an artist whose contributions, primarily through teaching, advocacy, organizing, and maintaining important repertoires, have greatly benefited their artistic tradition and whose efforts have significantly increased opportunities for and public visibility of traditional arts and artists.

III. MAKE A NOMINATION

To honor and preserve Guam's indigenous cultural heritage, the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities (CAHA) awards the Guam Masters Award – "Guam National Treasure" once every four (4) years to master folk and traditional artists. These awards recognize lifetime achievement, artistic excellence, and contributions to Guam's traditional arts heritage.

Should a discipline be recognized as representing an indigenous way of life perpetuating a traditional practice, but does not have a recognized master, then the nominees must be worthy of recognition and have a record of 20+ years of continuing artistic accomplishment. They must be actively participating in their art form, either as practitioners or as teachers. Guam Masters of Traditional and Folk Arts are selected according to the criteria of artistic excellence, significance within the particular artistic tradition and contributions to a living cultural heritage.

IV. HOW TO SUBMIT A NOMINATION

- A. A recognized Master of the discipline for which the individual is being nominated for should be the primary nominator.
- B. Masters may submit one or more nomination(s) in each round of the Guam Masters Award "Guam National Treasure" for Traditional and Folk Arts.
- C. No one may nominate him/herself.
- D. Each nomination should have a separate nomination package.
- E. Nominations packets must include the following:
 - 1. Nomination Statement/Letter

A statement/ letter that details the reasons that the nominee(s) should receive a Guam Masters Award – "Guam National Treasure". Describe the nominee's contributions to his or her particular artistic tradition and explain why this individual or group deserves recognition.

2. Work Samples Index Work Samples

For each work sample that you submitting for your nomination, provide the information below as relevant to your nomination:

A letter designation. Start with "A." List your samples in the order in which you want them reviewed. (e.g., A, B, C). Make sure that the letter on the Work Sample Index corresponds to the letter on the sample work itself. Each different CD, DVD-R, DVD-ROM, etc., should be considered one work sample. For digital images on a

CD, each set (not each image) should be considered one sample; follow your Wok Sample Index with a script that identifies each image separately.

- Format, e.g., CD (audio), CD (data), DVD-R, DVD-ROM, printed material. Static images (e.g., pictures) are acceptable.
- Identification of the artist or artist's work featured (e.g., Chamorro gentleman wearing brown såde' standing in front of a traditional Chamorro hut).
- Title or Description of the work or activity.
- Any special instructions for reviewing the sample, and, where relevant, specific selections on that sample.
 Include, as relevant:
 - The relevant track or chapter numbers, in priority order.
 - Real elapse time or cue information indicating the start of different selections, in priority order. Note
 your first cue as 0:00. If your second selection starts five minutes later, note the start of that as 5:00,
 etc.
 - Samples should be cued to the segment to be reviewed.
 - Any other information necessary to guide reviewers easily to the selections that you want.

Nominations must include work samples such as photographs, press clippings, performance programs or flyers, phonograph records, tape recordings, CDs, DVDs, digital recordings, web links, other forms of documentation, or actual samples of the individual's work in support of the nomination are encouraged. **Please limit support materials to no more than 20 items.** The nomination package will not be considered complete without these items. All materials must be labeled with the name of the nominee and the nominator's name. Work samples are a critical part of the nomination package and are considered carefully during review. Work samples should include recent, concise, and high-quality examples of the nominee's work.

3. Recommendation / Support Letters

Five (5) letters of personnel recommendation or letters of support that demonstrate expert and/ or community support of the nomination.

4. Additional Information

If the information is not included on nomination statement or letter, please attach:

- a. a resume or short biography that outlines a career of the nominee(s) and includes the following information:
 - 1. Number of years the nominee has been apprenticing, practicing, teaching and advocating their art form.
 - 2. Nominee's Mailing Address
 - 3. Nominee's Home Address
 - 4. Nominee's Contact Numbers: Work, home and cell phone number
 - 5. Nominee's email address
- b. a list of major public appearances or exhibitions by the nominee(s);
- c. and the titles of published works, if any.

F. Submitting Work Samples

The nomination package will not be considered complete without these items. All materials must be labeled with the name of the nominee and the nominator's name. Work samples are a critical part of the nomination package and are considered carefully during review. Work samples should include recent, concise, and high quality examples of the nominee's work.

a. Audio Samples

Submit no more than five (5) selections, one copy each OR a single CD containing all 5 audio selections. Each selection should not exceed five minutes.

b. Digital images

Submit no more than 20 digital images, one copy each OR a single DVD or CD containing all 20 digital images. Image size should be consistent; 800 x 600 pixels are suggested. Each image/file has a size limit of 5 MB. Acceptable file types are jpeg, gif, and tiff.

c. Video Samples

Submit no more than three (3) selections, one copy each OR a single DVD containing all 3 video samples. Each selection should not exceed five minutes.

d. Publications and catalogues

Submit no more than three (3) publications, one copy each OR a single CD containing all 3 selections.

- G. Use only paper clips and rubber bands to fasten your material. Do not bind or staple material.
- H. Support material will not be returned. Please do not send the only copy.
- I. A complete package should not exceed 20 pages in length. Excess pages will be removed and not reviewed.
- J. **Posthumous nominations** will not be considered.

V. DEADLINE FOR NOMINATIONS and WHERE TO SUBMIT NOMINATIONS

- A. Deadline to submit nomination packets with supporting materials to the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities is <u>4:00</u> p.m., <u>Day</u>, <u>Date</u>.
- B. Nomination packets must be submitted directly to the Offices of the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities located at Terlaje Professional Building, 1st Floor, 194 Hernan Cortez Avenue in Hagåtña. No fax, mail or email submissions will be accepted.

VI. REVIEW OF NOMINATIONS

Nominations submitted to the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities by the deadline are reviewed by an advisory panel of folk and traditional arts experts to verify authenticity and merit and to narrow the pool of nominees. Advisory Panel recommendations are forwarded to a panel of judges to determine the final recipients of the Guam Masters Award – "Guam National Treasure" based on the following selection criteria:

- (a) Exemplary and active practice of a traditional art form.
- (b) Apprenticeship, consummate skill and longevity in the promotion and perpetuation of a traditional art form.
- (c) Contributions to the traditional art form in areas of appreciation, knowledge, teaching, advocacy and advancement.

	(d)	Evidence of high artistic quality of work and mastery of traditional art form via support materials.			
	(e)	Continuing artistic accomplishment.			
	(f)	Participation in one's form via practicing or teaching.

After the panel review, recommendations are submitted to a panel of judges MADE UP OF THE LEAD PERSON FROM EACH PANEL, and a RECOGNIZED MASTER of the discipline for which the award is being considered, to determine the final 4 awardees. The recommended 4 awardees are presented to the Board of Directors for approval. THE ROLE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS IS TO CERTIFY THAT THE PROCESS HAS BEEN FOLLOWED AND MEETS THE CRITERIA DESCRIBED. THE ROLE OF STAFF IS TO RECEIVE THE NOMINATIONS AND TO SCREEN THEM FOR ELIGIBILITY ACCORDING TO THE CHECKLIST. IF ITEMS ARE MISSING, THE PACKET WILL NOT BE FORWARDED TO THE PANEL.

CHAPTER 85A GUAM MASTERS AWARD

- § 85A101. Short Title.

§ 85A101. Short Title.

This Act shall be known and cited as the "Guam Masters Award Act"

§ 85A102. Creation.

There is created within the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency (CAHA) the Guam Masters Award, to be given to accomplished practitioners of Guam's folk and traditional arts who have contributed to the preservation, advancement, and appreciation of their art.

§ 85A103. Award Frequency and Limitations.

CAHA shall accept nominations for the Guam Masters Award during the month of April 2010 and every four (4) years thereafter. No more than four (4) awards may be given during each award year. Nominations for the Guam Masters Award may be accepted from any party other than CAHA, members of its staff, management, and Board, or from a prospective award candidate.

§ 85A104. Selection Criteria.

Nominees for the Guam Masters Award shall be judged based on the following criteria:

- (a) Nomination submitted by a recognized Master of the discipline for which the nominee is being nominated.
- (b) Apprenticeship, consummate skill, and longevity in the promotion and perpetuation of a traditional art form.

- (c) Contributions to the traditional art form in areas of appreciation, knowledge, teaching, advocacy, and advancement.
- (d) Evidence of apprenticeship years, high artistic quality of work, mastery of traditional art form via support materials .
 - (e) Continuing artistic accomplishment.
 - (f) Participation in one's art form by apprenticing, teaching, and mastery of traditional art form.
 - (g) Artistic excellence.
- (h) Benefit to artistic tradition through contributions such as teaching, advocacy, organizing, and preserving important repertoires.
 - (i) Contribution to living cultural heritage.
- (j) Active engagement in preserving the folk and traditional arts
- (k) Increase in opportunities for and public visibility of traditional arts and artists through the nominee's efforts.

§ 85A105. Selection Procedures.

- (a) CAHA staff shall review nomination packets to ensure criteria and guidelines have been met.
- (b) A panel of experts, to be determined by CAHA based on the nominees' disciplines, shall convene to verify authenticity and merit, and to narrow the pool of nominees.
- (c) A panel of judges, inclusive of a recognized Master, to be determined by CAHA, shall convene to determine final recipients of the Guam Masters Award based on the Selection Criteria listed herein.
